# **WET PLAYTIMES**

We want to reduce wet play times at school this Autumn and Winter. When children aren't able to go out to play at lunch time they tend to be less able to concentrate during the afternoon. This Autumn and Winter children will be able to go outside in all kinds of weather. To do this, children will need a waterproof coat for school. On Tuesday this week only children who had a waterproof coat were allowed outside at lunch time. This upset some children as they also wanted to go outside but did not have a suitable coat.

All children need to have in school:

# A waterproof coat

A pair of wellies (boots or outdoor shoes) that will hang on their peg in an outdoor shoe bag.

The bag can be a plastic bag, draw string bag, PE style bag, rucksack, etc. Any bag that can hold a pair of outdoor shoes and hang on their peg.

This will mean that each day your child can put on their outdoor shoes if they want to use the grass areas at lunch time. It will be wonderful if you can donate any spare wellies, waterproof coats, waterproof trousers, waterproof all in one suits or any bags that can be used to hold the outdoor shoes.

Thank you for all the items that you have already donated for our outdoor play project.
